# **Annual Report**

The past twelve months of the operation of the Association have been very busy to say the least with the continued lobbying of the London Mayor, TfL and the Boroughs to hopefully try and make it easier for our Members to operate their coaches in and around our Capital City.

We have continued to represent our Members at meetings with TfL, the London Boroughs, the City of London, Heathrow Airport, FTA and CPT and it would be fair to say our officers have done an excellent job in representing the Members and making sure that as far as possible we have put the case for coach operators operating coaches in London.

As you are all aware, our Administration and Development Director Peter Bradley has now been in post since December 2016, and I must say that I think Peter has put his heart and soul into the LTCOA and although it might appear we have not achieved a lot we have seen quite a bit of progress in the following areas:

# 1. Number of Members We have attracted at least five new members in the past

# 2. Picking Up & Setting Down Passengers on Red Routes Trial

This is a major successful outcome of many years of hard work by a great many people, but I do believe that it is mostly due to the persistence of Peter and his knowledge of the people who work at TfL and perhaps using different negotiating skills.

But for this trial to work we will need to make sure that all of our Drivers and Clients obey the rules going forward and do not abuse them. During the year we have held:

- Seven members meetings with various speakers throughout the year;
- Members Christmas Dinner at the Pheasant Inn Heathrow;
- Annual Dinner & Dance at the Royal Garden Hotel

We now have 39 Member Companies and that will be one of the challenges for Peter going forward for us to increase our Membership numbers.

I must say a very big thank you to the Board of Directors of the Association for attending the Board Meetings through the past twelve months and the work that they have done on behalf of the Membership of the Association.

Overall, I think that the last year has been a successful year for the Association, but we cannot afford to sit on our laurels; we still have a lot more to achieve going forward into 2018.

#### Victoria Embankment – Somerset House set down and pick up bay

The front half of the Somerset House set down and pick up coach bay will be closed on the following dates (inclusive) in May 2018:

- Thursday 3 May
- Monday 7 to Tuesday 15 May
- Sunday 20 to Friday 25 May

This is to facilitate deliveries to an exhibition.

# Consultation on the use of \$19 and \$22 permits for road passenger transport in Great Britain

This significant consultation is now open until 4 May 2018. The association will be submitting a robust response stating that if a vehicle is carrying the general public it should be driven by someone who has been properly trained, whatever the distance and fare paid (if any). ## Red Routes in London - The Trial starts

The association is delighted to announce that the pilot scheme to allow coaches to set down and pick up on London Red Routes will commence on Monday 26 March and run until the end of June.

In a pioneering move, the LTCOA, CPT and TfL working under the remit of the Tourist Coach Action Plan (TCAP), have secured agreement for LTCOA and CPT member operators to set down and pick up at five locations on Red Routes in London for the duration of the trial.

The trial is the culmination of four year's work. If it is successful not only will it help alleviate the shortage of facilities for coaches in London but has the potential to open up a variety of additional locations to much more convenient access for customers arriving and departing by coach.

The locations for the initial trial are:

#### Addington Street - Park Plaza County Hall, SE1 7RY

Coaches may use local TfL bus stops for setting down and picking up.

#### Cromwell Road - National History Museum and Science Museum, SW7 5BD

Coaches should always set down and pick up in the existing coach bays when these are free. However, in periods of high demand when all existing bays are full, coaches may set down and pick up on the double red lines between the existing coach bays.

#### **Lower Thames Street - Old Billingsgate EC3R 6DX**

Coaches may pick up on double red lines outside the venue after 22:00 at this very busy location. In the longer-term TfL are considering the provision of a bay, to be made available at off peak times, which will formalise this arrangement.

#### Prescott Street, Grange Tower Bridge Hotel, E1 8GP

Coaches may set down and pick up on the double red lines to the west of the crossing zig zags, off peak (10:00 to 16:00) and overnight (19:00 to 07:00).

#### Southwark Street - Borough Market, SE1 1TL

Coaches may set down and pick up on Southwark Street close to Borough Market, so long as they do not cause an obstruction. In addition, there are four parking bays around the Hop Exchange which are not always utilised; coaches may use these if available and the double red lines prior to Stoney Street, if they keep clear of the island and do not block traffic flow.

**Please ensure that your drivers abide by the rules.** PCN's will be issued if coaches are observed setting down and picking up passengers at times outside those permitted or if no activity is detected (ie: if it appears that the coach is just parked up).

We want to make this a success. Please do come back to us if you have any issues during the trial or equally just to feedback that everything is working fine. We would welcome your comments.

Further locations will be introduced in the summer if all goes to plan!
